Kitsault Energy Left Out in the Cold by India Energy Week Organizers

WASHINGTON, D.C. - India Energy Week (IEW) promotes itself as a premier global forum where leaders from across the energy sector convene to exchange diverse perspectives, foster collaboration, and develop strategic solutions to the world's most pressing energy challenges. Against that backdrop, Krishnan Suthanthiran—President and Founder of Kitsault Energy—has raised serious concerns after his request to speak at the conference was declined.

Kitsault Energy is a forward-looking energy development project located northwest of Prince Rupert, British Columbia, with a vision aligned with global priorities in energy security, infrastructure development, and long-term sustainability. Given IEW's stated mission to encourage inclusive dialogue and actionable solutions, Suthanthiran questions why a project of this scope and relevance was excluded from the conversation. "In a time when the world is actively seeking innovative and collaborative approaches to energy development, it is troubling that a project like Kitsault Energy was not afforded the opportunity to participate," said Suthanthiran. "If India Energy Week is truly committed to diverse perspectives, then emerging projects with transformative potential should not be sidelined."

Recently, Suthanthiran and the Kitsault Energy team have made notable strides in engaging with senior government officials and stakeholders. They have also heightened public awareness of the project through coverage in both national and international media. A key highlight was The Vancouver Sun's feature on Kitsault Energy, which emphasized Suthanthiran's long-term goal of transforming the abandoned town of Kitsault into a major energy hub. This story has been picked up by several wire services, further boosting global interest in the project.

As governments and industry leaders pursue scalable, future-oriented energy solutions, excluding projects with clear vision and international relevance could undermine the very objectives IEW aims to promote.
